 We hope, you had a restful and enjoyable summer. Whether you are term time only or enjoyed booked time off, there is no denying that we have had a great summer weatherwise at least.

Pay

Many of you will have received the one-off payment of £200 for FT employees or the pro-rata equivalent in your July pay and additionally heard the news this week of the 4% pay increase for all bar those on the Living and Minimum wage, to be paid as from 1st August. UNISON worked with the College to ensure a fair pay increase and we very much welcome the offer announced by Andy Green this week. For the first time in over a decade we have one that is over the rate of inflation, all be it only just with the consumer price index running at 3.8%. Still a rise of 4% is very welcome and Unison will continue to work both locally and nationally to keep FE in the spotlight for government funding, recognising the vital role we play in providing the training and skills young people will need going forward.

Back in May of this year I attended an evening held in Westminster by the National FE & 6th Form Colleges committee, where we invited MPs to hear more about the role that Colleges play in training the future workforce of the country. For too long Colleges have been woefully underfunded.

Supporting Learners

Unison is very aware of the substantial increase of Learners with EHCP's and the additional pressures this puts on workloads for both teaching and support staff. With the CCG enrolling more students with additional needs across the group, the pressure on staff is greater than ever.

UNISON recognizes that all students deserve an equal opportunity to succeed, but this requires adequate staffing. we have raised concerns with both the CCG management and nationally through the Unison FE Colleges committee.

Student behaviour in colleges



Back in June Karen attended the National Local Government conference. Here she spoke to conference on behalf of the FE & 6th form colleges committee on the increase nationally of violence in colleges. In a recent survey of UNISON members working in colleges, one in five told us they don't feel safe at work. If you are concerned about your wellbeing, please contact you rep.
